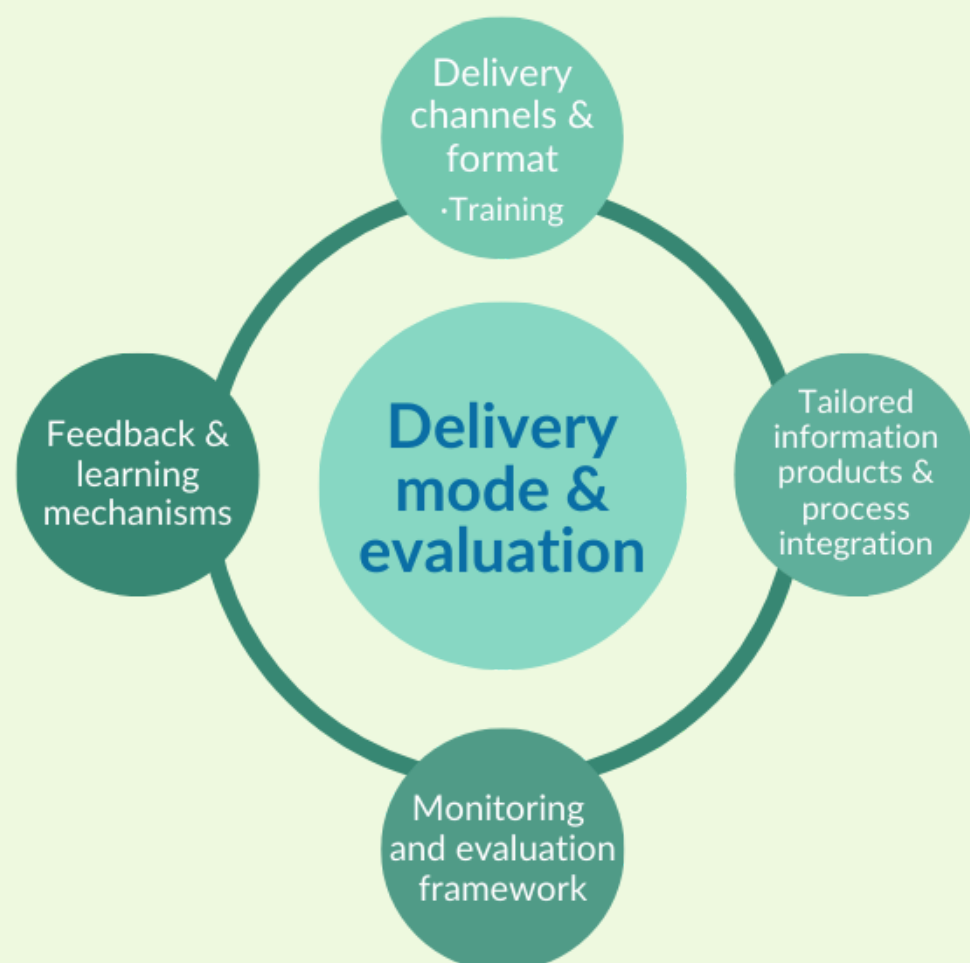


How can a climate service be delivered and evaluated?

Climateurope2 has identified four main components as a step towards defining the boundaries of climate services, which will help support the discussions on what constitutes a quality-assured and equitable climate service. One of these four components is the **delivery mode and evaluation**. This refers to the way a climate service is delivered and how this delivery is evaluated. It should include the tailored aggregation and combination of data and processes to match the decision and context of the service client.

Sub-components of delivery mode and evaluation



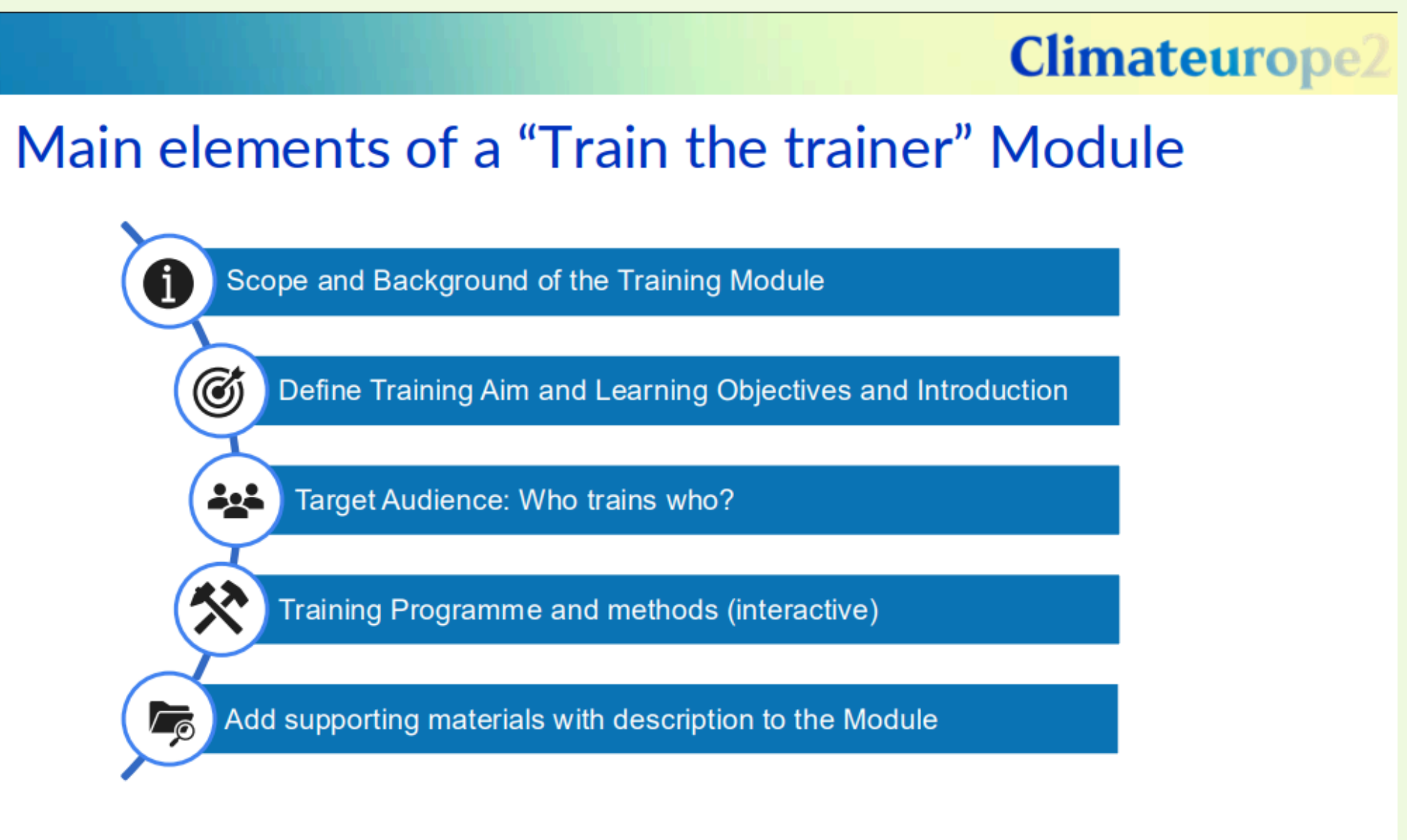
Together, these sub-components are fundamental to ensure the fitness-for-purpose of climate services. They support climate services to remain responsive to evolving needs and provide a basis for transparent, inclusive, and auditable standards for delivery and impact.

The delivery mode and evaluation component of a climate service encompasses the ways in which climate information is communicated, accessed, and embedded within user decision processes, as well as the mechanisms used to evaluate service performance over time. Even scientifically robust information will have limited value if it is not delivered in forms that are accessible, usable, timely, and actionable within a specific decision-making context. Great granularity in this area helps guide practical requirements for standardisation. Identifying key sub-components clarifies how climate services are delivered, integrated into user workflows and continuously improved through evaluation and learning.

Key sub-components include **delivery channels and formats**, including capacity building and training to support uptake; the **development of tailored information products and their integration** into existing workflows; **monitoring and evaluation** mechanisms; and **feedback and learning processes** that enable iterative improvement.

Example of a climate service delivery through a training

Training is important to build capacity, support standardisation efforts, and stimulate demand for climate services, contributing to Climateurope2's mission of advancing climate adaptation and mitigation across sectors. Train the trainers is a guidance document, consisting of a set of slides, provides a format for developing a "Train the Trainers" Module. It suggests what elements such a module could contain. It is an example of a format for delivering a climate service and could be tailored as best suited for the purpose.
